### Sunday Reflection from Fr. Pius Duke

Persecution often troubled the lives of the prophets. The first reading reminds us of the persecution faced by prophet Jeremiah. Here, we read how the contemporaries and friends of the prophet Jeremiah denounce him because he stands for the cause of truth and justice. Jeremiah laments the hardship caused by their actions, and this is highlighted by Jesus who asks his followers to be brave in promoting their faith. Jesus, in this gospel, views persecution as a kind of cloak that his disciples will have to wear if they are to be firm in their beliefs. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that all members of the People of God are potentially prophetic and need to play their part in handing on the truth about God. Therefore, "The whole people of God participates in the prophetic office of Christ and bears the responsibilities for the mission and service that flows from it" (CCC 786). However, the prophet takes consolation in his faith and trust in God who acts as his protector amid the persecutions. In the gospel text, Jesus admonishes us not to fear those who can only destroy the body but have no power to destroy the soul. The one to fear is God who has the power to destroy both body and soul. The fear of men and fear of losing our lives for the sake of the gospel lead us to deny both Christ and his gospel message. Jesus assures us of security amidst persecutions: "Every hair on our head has been counted." In the words of Martin Luther King Jr. "although the forces of evil may temporarily conquer truth, truth will ultimately conquer its conqueror."
