Sunday Reflection from Fr. Pius Duke

Have you ever been so angry with the way things are around you to the point you stopped communicating with God? Perhaps the loss of a dear one, a tragic accident or losing the only thing that mattered to you in life has distanced you from looking up to God? Some people will easily blame God for any crisis they experience. Some find it difficult to trust and believe in God's word and his promises due to bad situations. Sadly, while turning away from God many are turning to New Age practices, and to practices like palm reading, tarot card reading and all sorts of other practices for solutions to life's problems. The second reading tells us that such people should know not be deceived as nothing good can come to those who are involved in such practices. In fact, seeking for solutions or advice from such people is the same as saying that you no longer have faith in God which suggest that God is not in control of your life.

Jesus is concerned about each one of us who have to face difficulties and sufferings of various kinds. He is merciful and compassionate. He knows that we are weak and are overburdened at times and so he wants to help us and be our strength and comfort. He invites us: "Come to me all you who work hard and who carry heavy burdens, and I will refresh you.... I am gentle and humble of heart and you will find rest." All those who go to him with complete trust and childlike dependence shall find real joy and consider it a blessing to share in the yoke of Jesus. Let us not seek anywhere this comfort, but in Jesus Christ alone.
