Sunday Reflection from Fr. Pius Duke

Mary's assumption is viewed to have been a divine gift to her as the 'Mother of God'. According to Fulton Sheen, "given further an immunity from original sin, there would not be in the Body of Our Lady the dichotomy, tension, and opposition that exists in us between body and soul... if the distant moon moves all the surging tides of earth, then the love of Mary for Jesus and the love of Jesus for Mary should result in such an ecstasy as to lift her out of this world." This statement puts to rest the doubt about Mary's assumption. Mary was chosen by God, was conceived immaculate, bore Jesus the son of God and yet remained a virgin. It is logical that her body would experience no corruption. She was, and still remains, the ark of the New Covenant, and God preserved her body from corruption from her conception to death. Just as Mary completed her life as a shining example to the human race, the perspective of the gift of Assumption is offered to the whole human race. Her assumption into heaven also helps us to know that heaven is the final destination of those who do the will of God. Mary is therefore, offered to us as a model of deep faith, and as disciples of her son Jesus, we are called to learn from her example so that our lives, too, can be offered to God in gratitude just as Mary did, for Him to do great things in the world through us. No doubt, it is a big challenge but our complete surrender to God's will, like Mary, will pave the way for God's goodness in the world. Are you willing to be a 'Sacred vessel' like Mary that carries Jesus within and reflects Him to the world?
