Sunday Reflection from Fr. Pius Duke

I once ask a group of men and women in a Bible study group to feel free to pick and choose from the Gospels only what appeals to them. What passages do you think they were comfortable to choose? Most members of the group went for the stories about Christ's birth and infancy, his temptation in the desert and his healing miracles. Others went for their favourite parables, like the prodigal son, the Pharisee and the publican, the parable of the talents, the good Samaritan, and the feeding of the five thousand. It was interesting that no one included the Gospel of today, which is considered by many as a hard teaching about renouncing self, taking up the cross, losing our lives for the sake of Jesus. In today's Gospel Jesus ask the question: what will a person give in exchange for his or her life? Everything we have is a generous gift from God. We owe him everything, including our very lives. It is possible to give God our money, but not ourselves, or to give him lip service, but not our hearts. As St Paul says in the second reading, we must be careful not to be trapped by the lure of glamour of the secular world around us. A true disciple gladly gives up all that he or she has in exchange for an unending life of joy and happiness with God. God gives without measure. No sadness or loss can diminish the joy he offers. Christ's Cross leads to victory and freedom from sin and death. What is the cross which Jesus Christ is commanding you take up each day? Are you ready to lose all for Jesus Christ in order to gain all with Jesus Christ?
