Sunday Reflection from Fr. Pius Duke

Our lives are full of challenges and many a time we tend to despair. In the words of the gospel today we hear Jesus telling the apostles "Courage, it is I. Do not be afraid" Jesus is real in all generations for he is eternal. After Elijah dealt mercilessly with the prophets of Baal he ran from Israel for fear of Jezebel. He ran for his dear life. Unsure of what awaits him. He found himself in a cave. And God sent him a sign that he is not abandoned through the passing of a gentle breeze. God found him in a cave and asked him to go back to Israel and ".... stand before me" to act again as Yahweh's servant. (cf 1kg. 17: 1; 18:15). Such is God's intervention in our lives especially when we think that all hope is lost. There are many Christians today who have lost bearing and forgotten where they began the journey of faith and join the path that leads to doom. They follow all sorts of strange doctrines, thereby endangering their faith due to seeking short-cuts and an easy way out of their problems. Yet Jesus refuses to abandon them high and dry. In the gospel we saw how he fed the people and manifested his glory before his disciples when he walked on the sea. We must be aware of the presence of Jesus which brings us peace even in the wildest storms of life: the storms of anxiety and worries about the future we are suffering now in the ongoing Coronavirus pandemic, storms of sorrow, storms of doubt, tension and uncertainty, storms of anger and despair, storms of temptations, and storms in family relationships. Jesus assures us of the special peace that comes from a personal relationship with God, enhanced through prayer, meditative reading of Scripture, and active participation in the Holy Mass and reception of the Sacraments.
