Unfortunately, numbers are limited for each, and only family members may attend.

“Fratelli Tutti”. St. Francis of Assisi, whose feast day should have been last Sunday, used to address his followers as “Fratelli tutti” – “Brothers and sisters all” – when he wanted to impress on them the importance of living according to the message of the Gospel. Last week Pope Francis used the same address to begin his latest Encyclical Letter. An Encyclical Letter is one of the highest levels of teaching in the Church, and this is Pope Francis' third Encyclical Letter. His second was *Laudato Si*, which was a plea to care for the world, our common home. This Letter is a plea from Pope Francis to care for our brothers and sisters. It is quite long (287 paragraphs) but not too difficult to read. It is basically a call for more human fraternity and solidarity. He says that he offers this social Encyclical “as a modest contribution to continued reflection, in the hope that in the face of present-day attempts to eliminate or ignore others, we may prove capable of responding with a new vision of fraternity and social friendship that will not remain at the level of words.” He also says, “As I was writing this letter, the Covid-19 pandemic unexpectedly erupted, exposing our false securities. Aside from the different ways that various countries responded to the crisis, their inability to work together became quite evident. For all our hyper-connectivity, we witnessed a fragmentation that made it more difficult to resolve problems that affect us all. Anyone who thinks that the only lesson to be learned was the need to improve what we were already doing, or to refine existing systems and regulations, is denying reality.”

If you cannot get to Mass – and the Sunday obligation to attend Mass has been lifted for the time being – you can still join in by watching a live Mass via the wonders of modern technology. Here is a prayer, an Act of Spiritual Communion, which you can say as you watch a Livestream Mass:

“My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.”

Prayer at the end of Mass:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus, O merciful, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! *Pray for us, O holy Mother of God*, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.

Updated Restrictions For Places Of Worship. Since Monday, 28th September, the following changes to government restrictions have come into effect:

- Weddings: attendance is now limited to 15 people.
- Baptisms: For baptisms outside of the context of a parish Mass, attendance is limited to 6 people. For baptisms in the context of a parish Mass, the capacity limit of the church applies.
- Funerals: no change i.e. attendance limited to 30 people.
- Mass: If you are attending Mass with others, then the group should not exceed 6 people. A group of six can be made up of people from outside your household, but social distancing must be maintained between members of different households. The only exception to this new rule is where a single household (or support bubble) contains more than six people, but the same rules on social interaction with others outside of the group apply.
- Confirmation & First Holy Communion: In the context of a parish Mass, the normal capacity limit of the church applies. If it is not within a Mass then only six may attend.

PLEASE REMAIN VIGILANT. Wear a face covering in the church and keep a safe distance from other people. If you or anyone with whom you have been in contact has symptoms of Covid-19 please do not come to church. Thank you for your co-operation with these measures to help stem the spread of Covid-19 and keep those attending our church safe.
