Praying for the Dead in November. A question that sometimes comes up is, "What do we mean in the Creed when we say that we believe in the communion of saints?" I think it can best be summed up in the phrase, "We are all in this together". Within the Church we are united, held together by the one Spirit in the one Lord, and that unity extends, not only throughout the world, but throughout time and into eternity. We are in the same community as the saints, the holy men and women who have gone before us and now enjoy the fulness of life in heaven. They are the "Church Triumphant" and we ask them to pray for us, the "Church Militant", who are still engaged in the daily spiritual battles. But what about the people who have died in union with Jesus but who are marked with the stain of sin? We believe that only the perfect may enter heaven. St John Henry Newman once wrote, "Heaven would be hell to an irreligious man"; when we behold the perfection of God we realise how bad we are. Purgatory is for the purifying of those souls so that they may be fit to enter heaven. The community there is called the "Church Suffering" and we can help them with our prayers and most of all by offering the sacrifice of the Mass for them. We do this at all times, but especially during November we remember our brothers and sisters, one with us in the communion of saints, and we ask Almighty God to have mercy on them and bring them to the joys of heaven.

If you cannot get to Mass – and the Sunday obligation to attend Mass has been lifted for the time being – you can still join in by watching a live Mass via the wonders of modern technology. Here is a prayer, an Act of Spiritual Communion, which you can say as you watch a Livestream Mass:

“My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.”

Prayer at the end of Mass:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus, O merciful, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! *Pray for us, O holy Mother of God*, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

- **November Prayers for the Dead.** There are slips of paper available to write the names of those for whom you wish to pray during November. Place them in one of the baskets in front of the altar and they will be remembered at Mass during the month.
- **There will be a Parish Memorial Mass for those in the parish and our family/friends who have died,** especially those whose funerals have been held here during the past year, on Saturday, 28th November, 11.00 am. If you would like anyone's name to be included in this special commemoration please let me know (in writing). All welcome.
- **Remembrance Sunday.** Sunday, 8th November, will be Remembrance Sunday when we remember and pray for those who have died in past and present wars. We shall have a short service after the parish Masses to lay a wreath at the foot of the cross and pray for those who died and for peace.
