Kim sometimes comes to Mass here at Sacred Heart, and she has been preparing for this for a long time. I invite you all to share her joy on this occasion. Please pray for her and for her family.

**Education Sunday.** Today is Education Sunday when we are asked to pray for the work of Catholic education across the schools of the Archdiocese of Birmingham. There will be a second collection for the Catholic Education Service at Masses this weekend.

**Gift Aid Donors.** There are still envelopes that gift aid donors have not picked up yet. It is essential that you use your envelopes for your offertory, otherwise we cannot claim the tax back on your weekly offerings.

Secondly, we need to know if you are no longer paying tax, so that we can take you off our records. If you have moved house in the past 2 years, we need an up-to-date address for you. **We need this information as soon as possible so that we can send in our claim for the year 2020/21.**

Gift aiders are important to the parish, and over the past few years we have lost several gift aiders, so it is vital that we can claim funds for the parish in this way, especially at this present time. We would like to encourage all taxpayers, who do not at present gift aid their offerings to the church, to consider doing so, please.
