Welcome to Sacred Heart Church for Mass today.

If you are here with us for the first time today, welcome. If you are returning to Mass after a period of time away because of the pandemic, welcome back! It is lovely to see you again today. If you are a new student at Oxford or Oxford Brookes University, welcome to Oxford and to our parish. Welcome too to returning students whose digs this year are in our parish. We would love you to make your home with us during your time at university.

Things are starting to come to some sense of 'normality', but I should not like our new normal to be only half-filled churches. I think the time has come to ask everyone here today to encourage others to return to Mass soon, please. A personal invitation may be just the encouragement some people are needing. You can assure them that the church is ventilated, masks are worn, sanitiser used, the benches are cleaned, and parishioners respect the need to be careful. If people are nervous about coming to Sunday Mass, they can start with a weekday Mass (Monday morning or Thursday evening). The feast is ready, all that is needed is the guests. Come to the wedding feast.

Prayer at the end of Mass:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus, O merciful, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! *Pray for us, O holy Mother of God*, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Here is a prayer, **an Act of Spiritual Communion**, which you can say as you watch a Livestream Mass:

"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You."

Home Mission Sunday. Today is Home Mission Sunday – a day when the Bishops invite parishes to pray for the mission of the Church in England and Wales. There will be a second collection at Masses this weekend to support the Bishops' work of evangelisation. Here in England, in Oxford, in our own parish, there is a pressing need for Catholics (that's you and me) to discover a renewed missionary impulse which reaches out to people who have never known Christ and his Gospel as well as to baptised Catholics who have lost a living sense of faith. The mission territory of the Church is all the world; the families and communities of this part of Oxford is ours!

Br. Ambrose May OFM Cap RIP. Br. Ambrose passed away peacefully at Greyfriars Friary last Sunday afternoon. He was born in Oxford just over 88 years ago in Cowley Road and most recently has been parish priest at Greyfriars until 2011. Thank you for your prayers for the repose of his soul. The Requiem Mass will be at St Edmund and St Frideswide, 182 Iffley Road, Oxford, OX4 1SB on Monday, 27th September, at 10:00 am.

Nuala Scarisbrick RIP. Nuala and her husband Jack co-founded Life, a pregnancy support charity based on the principles of Catholic Social Teaching. Life helps more than 60,000 people a year as they face pregnancy or pregnancy loss. Her legacy is tens of thousands of people here today who otherwise would have been aborted.

Eucharistic Ministers' Day of Recollection.

Gift Aid Donors. There are still envelopes that gift aid donors have not picked up yet. It is essential that you use your envelopes for your offertory, otherwise we cannot claim the tax back on your weekly offerings. Secondly, we need to know if you are no longer paying tax, so that we can take you off our records. If you have moved house in the past 2 years, we need an up-to-date address for you. **We need this information as soon as possible so that we can send in our claim for the year 2020/21.**


CATHOLICISM MADE SIMPLE
