### Welcome to Sacred Heart Church for Mass today.

If you are here with us for the first time today, welcome. If you are returning to Mass after a period of time away because of the pandemic, welcome back! It is lovely to see you again today. If you are a new student at Oxford or Oxford Brookes University, welcome to Oxford and to our parish. Welcome too to returning students whose digs this year are in our parish. We would love you to make your home with us during your time at university.

### Prayer at the end of Mass:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus, O merciful, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! *Pray for us, O holy Mother of God*, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

**Gift Aid Donors.** There are still envelopes that gift aid donors have not picked up yet. It is essential that you use your envelopes for your offertory, otherwise we cannot claim the tax back on your weekly offerings.

Secondly, we need to know if you are no longer paying tax, so that we can take you off our records. If you have moved house in the past 2 years, we need an up-to-date address for you. **We need this information as soon as possible so that we can send in our claim for the year 2020/21.**

**Today is Prisoners' Sunday** when we are asked to pray for prisoners, their families and all of those affected by imprisonment and those who support them. PACT (Prison Advice and Care Trust) supports prisoners, ex-offenders and their families. It cares for those who are lonely, isolated and abandoned and through that care carries a message of hope for a fresh start and a new beginning and to help to reduce the harm caused by imprisonment, especially for the children who are left behind. We are slowly getting through the replies and contacting people who have expressed an interest in the various possible activities. **Prayers for Vocations.** There are Vocations Prayer Calendars available at the back of church detailing who or what to pray for each day of each month. As you know, October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. If the Rosary has never been part of your prayer life, why not give it a go this October and pray it for Vocations to the Priesthood or the Permanent Diaconate?

**Morning Prayer.** Each morning (except Wednesdays and Thursdays) I pray the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer of the Church in Our Lady's. You are welcome to join me, either through the livestreaming or by coming to church. Times may vary, so please check.

**The Assisted Dying Bill, 2021 and a Novena asking for the prayers of Pope John Paul II.** The Assisted Dying Bill is due to receive its Second Reading in the House of Commons, with full debate, on Friday, 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 2021. This means legalised assisted suicide and it is not something that, as Catholics, we should simply allow to come to pass. There will be a national novena, starting this Wednesday, asking for the intercession of St John Paul II. **It will run from 13<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> October.**

Bishop John Sherrington (the Bishop responsible for the Day for Life) has said: Jesus told his disciples to pray at all times and not lose heart. Providentially the discussion of Baroness Meacher's Bill in the House of Lords falls on the feast of St John Paul II on 22nd October. The novena, asking the intercession of St. John Paul II, who spoke courageously about the infinite worth of each human person and witnessed to the cross in his final illness, calls upon Catholics and all who share our view that assisted suicide is wrong, to pray with perseverance that this Bill will be defeated.

#### ***The Novena Prayer:***

*Merciful God, we pray with thanks and gratitude for the great spiritual gift of Saint John Paul II's apostolic life and mission. Through his heavenly intercession we ask that the 'Assisted Dying' Bill be defeated and that the infinite worth of each human person is upheld through proper investment in palliative care. Grant also that we may grow in love for You and proclaim boldly the love of Jesus Christ to all people. Through Christ, Our Lord. Amen.*
