Welcome to Sacred Heart Church for Mass today.

Here is a prayer, **an Act of Spiritual Communion**, which you can say as you watch a Livestream Mass:  
*'My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.'*

### Prayer at the end of Mass:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus, O merciful, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! *Pray for us, O holy Mother of God*, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

**A Liturgical Note:** During Lent we do not say the Gloria during Mass on Sundays, nor the joyful word “A\*\*\*\*\*a!” There are no flowers decorating the altar or the lectern, and the statues in the church will be veiled until Holy Saturday.

Here are some things we can do as a parish during Lent:

1. **Prayer petitions.** You can write out any petition that you would like the rest of us to pray for and post it up on a board in the church hall.
2. **My Day By Day and the Walk With Me Booklets** for Lent are available (£1).
3. **Stations of the Cross.** We shall meditate on the Stations after Mass each Thursday, 7.30 pm.
4. **Lectio Divina.** For half an hour, following the 9.15 am Mass on Mondays. All welcome.
5. **Parish Lent Day of Recollection,** Saturday, 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 10.00 am - 4.00 pm. There will be a talk and a time of prayer. All welcome.
6. **Parish Penance Service.** On Thursday, 31<sup>st</sup> March at 5.00 pm, before the evening Mass.

You are invited to send in your petitions to the Mill Hill Missionaries. They will be placed at St Joseph's Altar during the Novena, to be remembered in the Masses and prayers. You can also join online – Masses from St Joseph's in Maidenhead will be held via Zoom: 7:30 pm on weekdays, 10:00 am on Saturday, 12<sup>th</sup> March, and 11:00 am on Sunday, 13<sup>th</sup> March. **COVID precautions.** The latest guidelines from the Bishops' Conference make these points:

- Anyone with symptoms of Covid should stay at home.
- Hand sanitiser should be available for all to use at places of entry and exit to our churches.
- The necessity for social distancing is removed. (Note that in Sacred Heart we shall continue to make the left side of the church available for parishioners who prefer to keep some distance).
- Those who wish to wear a face covering may do so during the celebration of Mass. (Note that in Sacred Heart I ask that you continue to wear a face covering).
- Altar servers are encouraged to return.
- Singing can occur and there is a general encouragement to wear face coverings while singing. However, it is recognised that not everyone will feel able to do this.
- There is no further need for track and trace.

**The Sacrament of Confirmation.** Bishop William will be coming to Sacred Heart on Sunday, 29<sup>th</sup> May to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation during the 6.00 pm Mass. **CAFOD Lent Fast Day, this Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> March.** This year CAFOD is focussing on helping children around the world who are malnourished. But of course, there is now an emergency caused by the war in Ukraine, and CAFOD will be working with the DEC to help there. We want to support them in both endeavours by having a second collection next weekend.
