
World Mission Sunday. Next Sunday, 23rd October, is World Mission Sunday and there will be a second collection for Missio. On this day the whole Church around the world unites in prayer for its missionary activity, and in collecting funds to support Catholic communities across the world living in situations of poverty and privation. The theme chosen by the Holy Father for this year is: 'You shall be my witnesses' (Acts 1:8). All donations go to the Universal Solidarity Fund to meet the material needs of Catholic communities too young, too small or too poor to support themselves. Donations help them to live out the mission entrusted to them by the Lord. Thank you for your ongoing support of Missio through prayer and charity.
