**Feast of the Immaculate Conception.** The phrase "Immaculate Conception" does not refer to the conception of Jesus, as some people think, but rather to the conception of Mary. Because the Immaculate Conception is the Patroness of the Archdiocese, this Feast, which falls on Thursday, is a big day for us. There will be Mass in Our Lady's School at 9.15 am to which all parishioners have been invited and there will also be Mass here at Sacred Heart at 7.00 pm.
