'My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.'

Prayer at the end of Mass:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus, O merciful, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! *Pray for us, O holy Mother of God*, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

1. **My Day By Day** and the **Walk With Me** Booklets will be available.
2. **Stations of the Cross**, at 5.00 pm each Sunday afternoon, before the evening Mass.
3. **Parish Lent Day of Recollection**, Saturday, 11th March, 10.00 am - 4.00 pm at Our Lady's, Hollow Way. There will be a talk, the chance for Confession, and a time of prayer. It will be open to all, but it will be especially for Eucharistic Ministers, in preparation for renewal of their ministry on Maundy Thursday.
4. **Parish Penance Service.** On Thursday, 23rd March, before the evening Mass at 5.30 pm.

Saturday morning Mass and Confessions during Lent. It seems that Thursday evening is not a good time for people to come out for Confession and Mass, and so during Lent I should like to invite you to Mass, with Confessions before Mass, on Saturday mornings (for those Saturdays when I can be here).

Lent House Masses. This is an idea to celebrate Mass in parishioners' homes in different parts of the parish. It could bring all sorts of blessings, including attracting some people who do not come to Sacred Heart at present. If you would like/be willing to be a host for a House Mass during Lent, please let me know; it means inviting your Catholic neighbours (non-Catholics are welcome too) to come to your home. Ask them to bring some refreshments so that we can have a simple shared meal after Mass.

Ashes for Ash Wednesday (22nd February). If you have palms from last Palm Sunday that we could use to make the ashes, please let me have them by next Sunday.
