**Gift Aiders.** First, a big thank you to everyone who gift aids their offerings. Anyone who pays income tax can do this. It means that if you give money to the Church we can get back the income tax you have paid to earn it. If you sign up as a gift aider, for every £1 you give we can claim back 25p from the Government. Second, it won't be long before Sally McVeigh will be putting out the new envelopes, so if any of your circumstances have changed (i.e. if you have stopped paying tax or your address has changed), or if you would like to start gift aiding, please let Sally know as soon as you can.
