Pope Francis has established 1st September as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, encouraging the Catholic community around the world to pray for our common home. This is the start of the Season of Creation (1st September to 4th October). The Archbishop has sent this message:

"As you may know this is something growing year by year as we become more and more aware of our calling as Christians to have a care for the whole of the Created world... Pope Francis is asking us to think about how we care for the whole of Creation as an expression of our own Christian Faith and is referring us to St. Paul's letter to the Romans, which speaks about the whole of Creation groaning, but also looking for the freedom which Christ brings us as children of God... Hope and Act with Creation is the theme for this year, and I hope you'll be able to pray that we and others will value all that we have in creation as a way of praising God and also caring for those who are most in need."
