Today is World Mission Sunday. This day of prayer, solidarity, and giving unites Catholics everywhere in sharing the Good News of God's love. Pope Francis invites all Catholics to support Missio, his charity for world mission, on this special day. There will be a second collection for Missio.

The Forty Hours Devotion will be observed at the Oxford Oratory between 6.00 pm on Friday, 18th October, and 6.00 pm on Sunday, 20th October.

Our Parish Christmas Bazaar will be on Saturday, 30th November. Raffle tickets will be on sale after Mass today. This is our main fundraising event for the parish. We shall have a few gaps in the ranks this year among the regular helpers, so if you would be willing to play a more active part in the life of our family here, please have a word with Sally after Mass today.

November is the month when we traditionally pray for those who have died. There will be envelopes soon for you to enclose your list of deceased friends and family and place them before the altar. There will also be a Parish Memorial Mass on Saturday, 16th November, for all parishioners who have died, especially for those who have died in the last year.

All Saints Day and All Souls Day. Friday, 1st November, is the **Solemnity of All Saints** which is a Holyday of Obligation. That means we should all do our best to attend Mass. There will be Mass at Our Lady's at 9.15 am, and here at Sacred Heart at 7.00 pm. **All Souls Day** will be on Saturday, 2nd November. It is not a Holyday of Obligation, but many people like to go to Mass to pray for their deceased family and friends. There will be Mass here at Sacred Heart at 10.00 am. and at Our Lady's at 12.00 noon.

Assisted Suicide Bill. An assisted suicide Bill received its First Reading last Wednesday. The next stage is the Second Reading, in which MPs will have the opportunity to vote on the Bill. That is scheduled for 29th November. If you have not already done so, please contact your MP to voice your opposition to this Bill.
