**Lent 2025.** Yes, I know it feels that we have only just celebrated Christmas, but Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, 5<sup>th</sup> March. That's only a few weeks away. It's time to start thinking how we can make this season of grace fruitful.

- If you have any palms from last Palm Sunday that you do not need, please bring them along by Sunday, 2<sup>nd</sup> March at the latest, so that we can burn them to make ashes for Ash Wednesday.
- During Lent we shall re-start our early morning Mass at Our Lady's on Mondays (7.00 am), followed by breakfast together in the hall. All welcome; it's a good way to start the working week.
- For the Jubilee Year I am planning a walking pilgrimage to Blessed Dominic Barberi, with a Lenten Retreat Day/reflection while we are there. More details to follow.
- There is a new resource available for this Jubilee Year. **We Dare to Hope** has been developed by the Bishops' Conference. It is for small group faith-sharing and for individual meditation, featuring five sessions on the jubilee theme of Christian Hope.
