Did you know???? There is a patron saint of the internet – St. Isidore. (Isidore wrote a collection of books called *Etymologiae*, which gathered, systematised, and condensed all the learning possessed by his time. Throughout the greater part of the Middle Ages it was the “search engine” most in use in educational circles.) So, whenever you start to use the internet, with its blessings and dangers, ask for the help of St. Isidore.
