Tailpiece: One Sunday the regular church organist was sick and a substitute had been brought in at the last minute. He asked the Parish Priest what he should play. The priest was a bit rushed and said, "Here's the order of Mass, but you'll have to think of something to play after I do the announcements." During the service, the priest paused and said, "Brothers and Sisters, we are in great difficulty; the roof repairs cost twice as much as we expected and we need £4,000 more. Any of you who can pledge £100 or more, please stand up." At that moment, the organist struck up the National Anthem. And that is how the substitute became the regular organist!
