Ash Wednesday. Lent starts this Wednesday. Mass at Sacred Heart will be at 7.00 pm. At Our Lady's it will be at 9.15 am. Ashes will be distributed at all Masses as a mark of sorrow for our sins and a reminder of our mortality. **It is a day of fasting and abstinence** (everyone over the age of 14 should abstain from meat, and those between 18-60 should also fast, taking only one meal and two lighter snacks).

We are a parish with a clear identity and purpose: to be a Catholic community, formed by the Holy Spirit in the name of Jesus, for the glory and praise of God the Father and the service of His Kingdom, and also for the mutual building up and support of its members. The core message that we feel called to live is contained in Jesus' words:

I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full. (John 10:10)

May our community receive your grace and deepen its faith in you.

Lent 2025. There are many things you can join in with to make this a fruitful season:

- 1. Stations of the Cross.** Each Thursday, after Mass.
- 2. Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament,** Thursdays, 6.00–7.00 pm, with the opportunity for Confession.
- 3. "My Day by Day" booklets** are available (£1). They contain the Mass readings for each day of Lent.
- 4. Walk With Me** booklets are also available, with Lent calendars. They are an aid to prayer and reflection.
- 5. CAFOD Lent Fast Day** will be Friday, 14th March.
- 6. Penance Service.** Thursday, 3rd April, 6.00 pm.
- 7. Early morning Mass** in Our Lady's on Mondays (7.00 am), followed by breakfast in the parish hall.
- 8. A walking pilgrimage** to Blessed Dominic Barberi, our nearest Jubilee church, with a Lenten Retreat Day/reflection. Saturday, 28th March. Leave Sacred Heart at 10.30 am. There will be Mass, prayer, a talk and a tour of the College. Bring a packed lunch. The Day finishes at 3.30 pm.
- 9. We Dare to Hope.** In Our Lady's parish hall on Monday evenings, at 7.00 pm., starting on 17th March. We can explore the jubilee theme of Christian Hope through scripture, prayers and a reflection with questions. Everyone is welcome to join in.
