- Stations of the Cross.** Each Thursday, after Mass.
- Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament,** Thursdays, 6.00–7.00 pm, with the opportunity for Confession.
- Walk With Me** booklets are available, with Lent calendars. They are an aid to prayer and reflection.
- Early morning Mass** at Our Lady's on Mondays (7.00 am), followed by breakfast in the parish hall.
- We Dare to Hope.** In Our Lady's parish hall on Monday evenings, at 7.00 pm., starting this Monday. We can explore the jubilee theme of Christian Hope through scripture, prayers and a reflection with questions. All welcome. There are five sessions:

  - 2 The Decision to Hope
  - 3 The Prayer of Hope
  - 4 Hope Against Hope
  - 5 Christ, Our Hope

**Easter Duties.** Because of the central importance of Easter to the Christian faith, the Church says that all Catholics who have made their First Holy Communion should receive the Holy Eucharist sometime between Ash Wednesday and Pentecost Sunday. They should also take part in the Sacrament of Penance before receiving this Easter Communion.

**Lent Parish Penance Service.** Don't forget that there will be a Penance Service here in Sacred Heart this Thursday evening, 3<sup>rd</sup> April, at 6.00 pm before the evening Mass. It will be a short reflection on the love of God who offers us forgiveness if we seek it, and it will include the opportunity for Confession.
