(There will also be 11.00 am Mass at Our Lady's on Christmas Day).

**"O Come, O Come, Emmanuel".** The second part of Advent starts this Wednesday, and is marked by the "O Antiphons" which highlight a different title each day for the Messiah and invite Him into our hearts: O Sapientia (O Wisdom), O Adonai (O Lord), O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse), O Clavis David (O Key of David), O Oriens (O Rising Sun), O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations), and finally, O Emmanuel.
