Peace Sunday. Next Sunday is a day of prayer for peace on earth, remembering the announcement of the angels at the birth of Christ, "peace to all people of goodwill".

World Leprosy Day. Each day 475 people are diagnosed with leprosy, more than 25 of these are children. But it is curable! Lepra works to help. For over 100 years Lepra's research has led to new approaches to healthcare programmes. Lepra seeks to provide better detection, treatment and support mechanisms, to advocate for those without a voice, to challenge prejudice wherever it exists, to strengthen local health systems and to help provide healthcare in partnership with local communities for a future free from the impact of leprosy. The second collection at Mass today will go to support their work.

The Christmas Crib Offerings. Today is the last opportunity if you wish to make an offering at the Crib. All crib offerings will go to Friends of the Holy Land, which supports Christians in the Holy Land in order to maintain a Christian presence there.

The Great Awakening - A Catholic Healing and Evangelisation Service. Saturday, 24th January, 9.00-4.30, at Bethel Convention Centre, West Bromwich (B70 7JW). Awakening is a Catholic Evangelisation and Healing Convention organised by Anointing Fire Catholic Ministries UK. This event is to rekindle the fire of the Holy Spirit and renew our commitment to the mission of the Church. The day includes Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, powerful preaching, praise, worship, and healing service. Speakers include Bishop Timothy Menezes, Auxiliary Bishop of Birmingham. A Pilgrimage with St. John Henry Newman! This Pilgrim Way is almost 40 miles long and follows St. John Henry's spiritual path, from Evangelicalism, through High Anglicanism and finally to Catholicism. The way starts at *Deddington* where Newman gave his first public address in 1825, via *Over Worton*, where he preached his first sermon as an Anglican priest, through *Oxford*, and ends at *Littlemore* where, in 1845, he became a Catholic.
