Bishop Richard's Visitation. You may remember from before Christmas that the Archbishop and our area Bishop, Bishop Richard Walker, are carrying out a pastoral visitation of each of the parishes in the North Oxford Deanery at this time. That means that one of them will come to each parish in turn for a weekend, to meet parishioners, to listen to their concerns and to speak to them about the plans of the Diocese, to celebrate Mass, and to visit some sick parishioners at home. Bishop Richard will be coming to visit Our Lady's Parish and Sacred Heart Parish on the weekend of 21st/22nd February. There will be a meeting in the hall here on Sunday, 22nd February, at 4.30 pm. Please try to come to one of them if you possibly can.

Eucharistic Ministers. There has been a request for us at Sacred Heart to re-introduce Communion under Both Kinds (i.e. the Precious Blood as well as the Body of Christ) by Easter. That would be good, but to do that we shall need several more Ministers of Holy Communion. If you feel that God is calling you to serve in this way, please come and see me. I shall arrange a training day soon.

First Holy Communions: 9.00 am, Sunday, 7th June.

Confirmations: 10.00 am, Saturday, 31st October.

First Holy Communion Lessons. Parents, if your children are aged 8 or over they can receive their First Holy Communion next June. Please complete one of the registration forms that you can find in the porch and return it to me. Lessons will start at Our Lady's on Thursday afternoons (after school) at the end of February.

Altar Servers. It would be lovely to have some new altar servers in time for the Bishop's visit. If you have made your First Holy Communion then you can be a server. If you would like to be a server, please let me know. We shall have a couple of training sessions on Saturday mornings, starting at 11.00 am on Saturday, 7th February.

Enquiries about the Catholic Faith will continue this week on Friday, 23rd January at 4.30 pm at Our Lady's, in the Don Bosco Centre, with "Holy Communion".

Candlemas. On Monday, 2nd February we shall celebrate the Feast of the Presentation in the Temple (Candlemas). There will be Mass here at Sacred Heart at 7.00 pm.
